

Snake



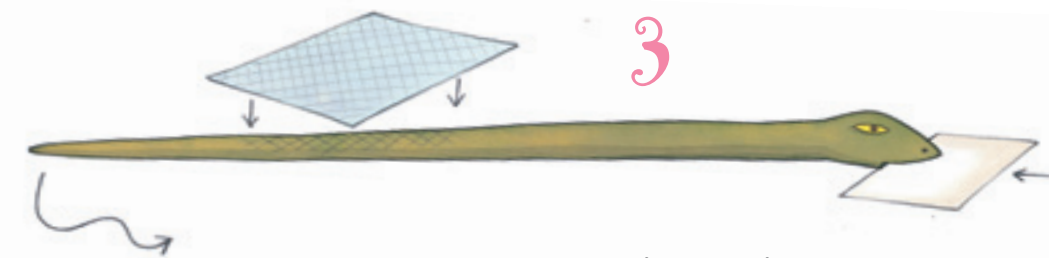

2. For the eyes, stick two little black balls on small sausages. Make the nostrils with a toothpick.

3. Open the mouth with a piece of cardboard. Then press a piece of mesh over the body for the scales. Lastly, bend it into an S-shape.



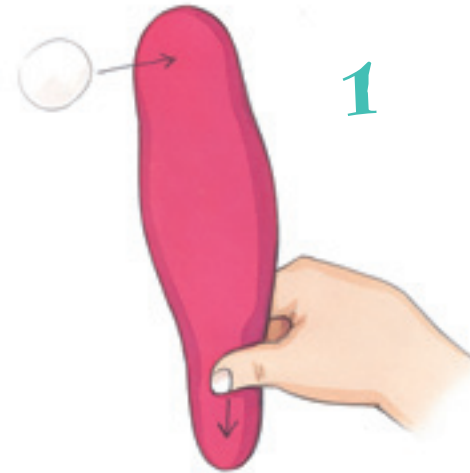

Colorful snakes

There are many different types of snakes, with very different colors and markings. Instead of the texture, you could make colored patches.



Parrot

1. Make a sausage and mold the head and tail shapes, narrowing the tail. Flatten a different colored ball on each side of the head.

2. Stick on two black balls for the eyes. You can make the beak with two different sized sausages, curved and narrowed at the ends. Flatten and narrow two sausages for the wings. Mark the tail feathers with a toothpick.

3. Use your fingers to create the wing texture. Place your parrot on a modeling clay branch and give it some claws made from small sausages.

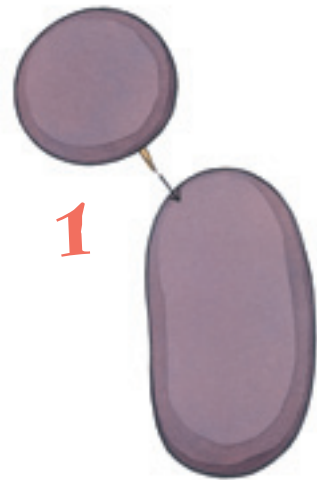

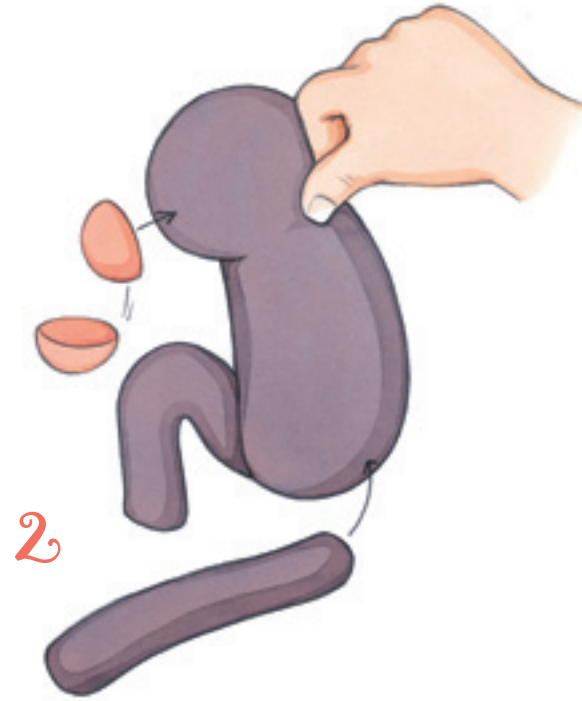
Chimpanzee

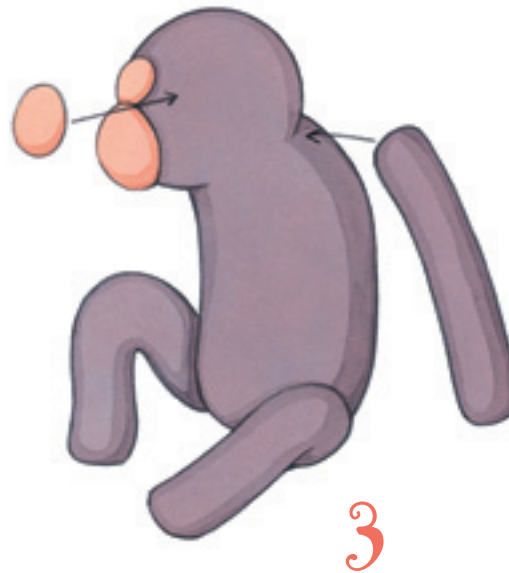
1. Use a toothpick to join a ball to a rounded sausage. You already have the head and body.

2. Secure the join with your fingers. Stick two long sausages onto the base for the legs and half a pink ball for the mouth area.



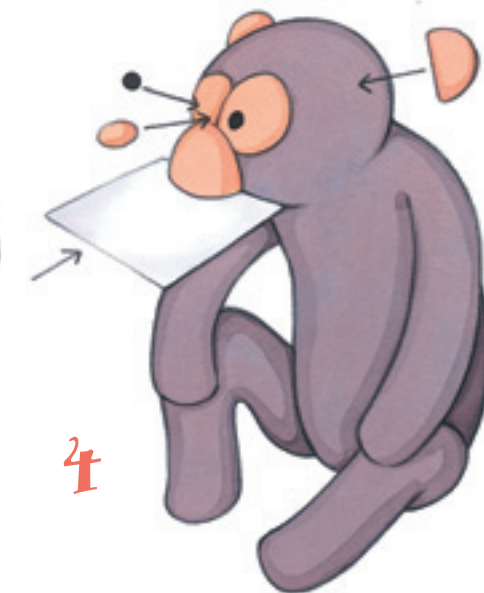

3. Stick two slightly smaller balls above the mouth. Make two long sausages for the arms and stick them onto the body.

4. A small ball will do for the nose and two little black balls for the eyes. Open the mouth with a piece of cardboard and make the ears from two half balls.



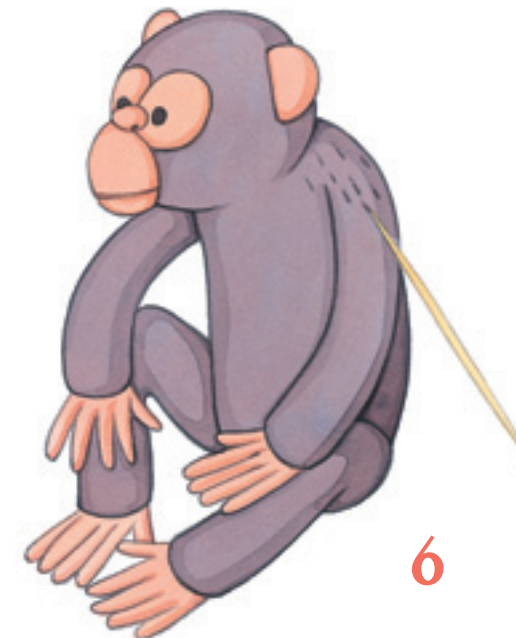

5. Use a toothpick to make two holes in the nose for the nostrils. To make the hands and feet, join five very thin sausages together and stick them on as shown in the drawing.

6. Finish by marking lines all over the body with a toothpick for the hair.

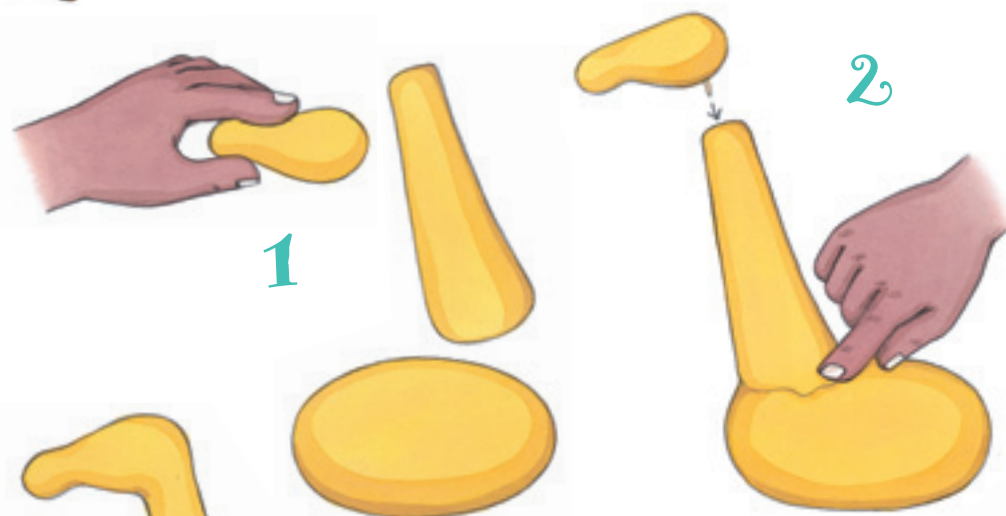
Loyal companion

Giraffe



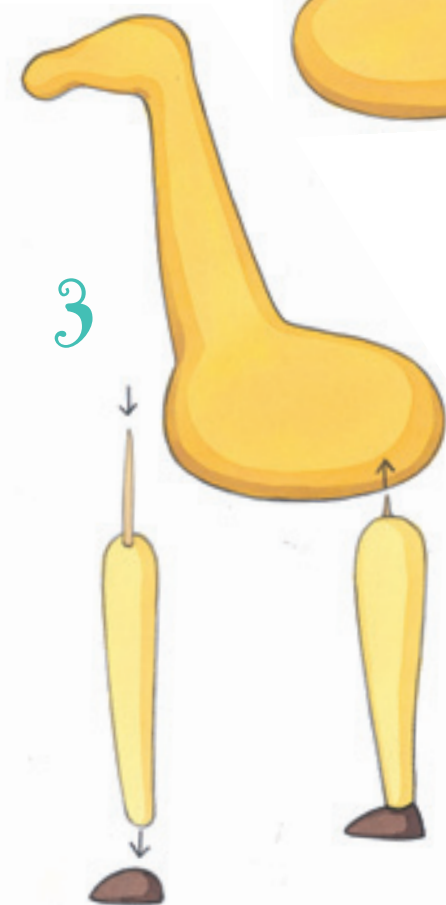

1. Mold three pieces:
An elongated ball for the body, a sausage for the neck and a smaller piece for the head.

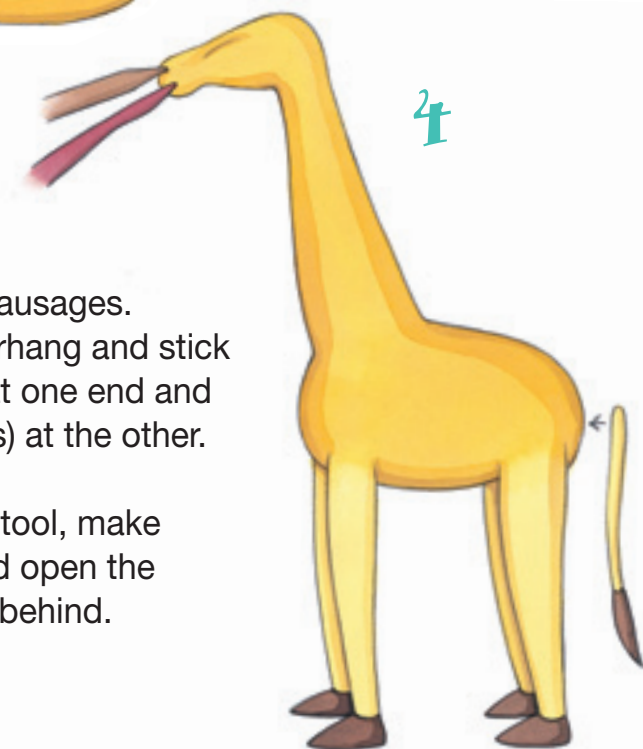
2. Join them together with
toothpicks and reinforce
them with your fingers.

3. To make the
legs, insert pieces
of skewer into four sausages.
Allow the tips to overhang and stick
them into the body at one end and
the hooves (half balls) at the other.

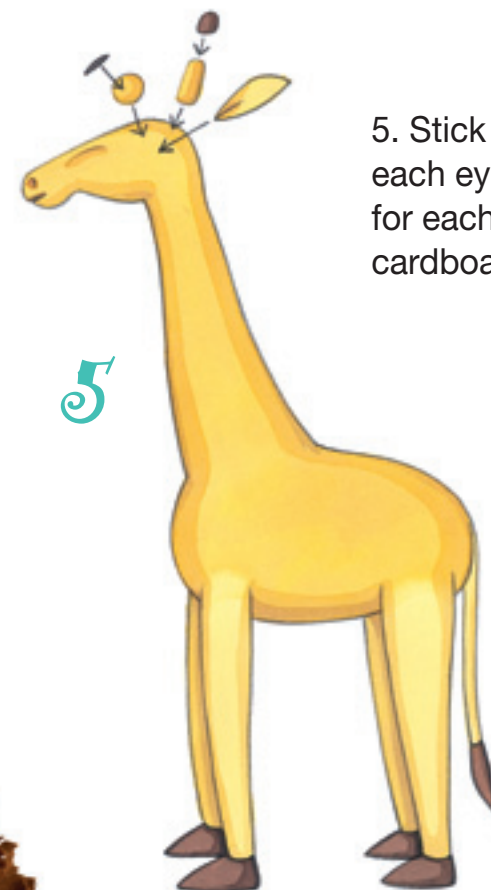
4. With the help of a tool, make
holes in the nose and open the
mouth. Stick the tail behind.

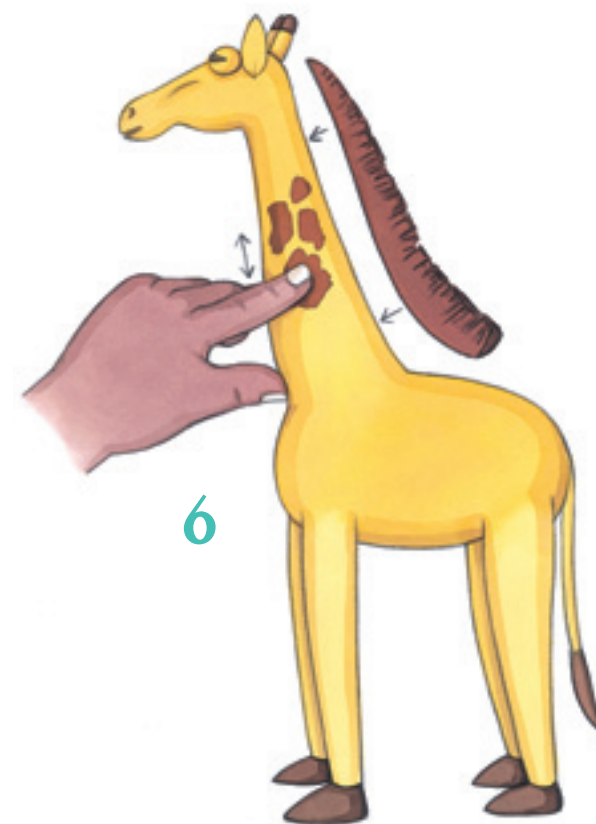
Reaching very high

5. Stick a sausage on a ball for
each eye and a little ball on a sausage
for each horn. Make some ears from
cardboard.

6. Spread patches all over the body
using small pieces of dark modeling
clay. To finish off, make a mane
from folded cut paper and stick it
into the neck.
