





Snail


1. Mold two sausages, each with a thinner end. Lift up the thickest end of the sausage that will be the body. For the shell, cut off the thick end of the other sausage and roll it up.



2. Cut the base off the body so that it stands up better. Stick on the shell with the help of a toothpick.



3. Stick a small sausage over the base of the shell. Make a nose and place it on the head.



4. Secure the nose join. Use a modeling clay tool to make the mouth opening.



5. Cut off two pieces of scoubidou and stick an eye onto each end. Then stick the other end into the head.

6. To finish, stick two smaller pieces of scoubidou under the nose.








Wasp

1. Model a pointed sausage and apply thin black stripes onto it. Bend the tip of the abdomen a little.

2. Insert a toothpick through a ball. Stick a larger ball onto one end. Join the toothpick to the abdomen.

3. Open a small round mouth with a pencil. Make the eyes from two balls with smaller balls in the middle.

4. Stick a small sausage onto the head to make the nose. To make the antennae, place some small balls onto two pieces of scoubidou.

5. Stick three pieces of toothpick onto each side of the thorax to make the legs.

6. Cut out two wings from baking paper. Color them with felt tipped pens and stick them into the upper part of the thorax.







In nature, the yellow and black color combination means "danger". Insects with these colors are usually those that sting.








Lizard

1. Make two pieces:
An oval for the head and
a long sausage pointed
at one end for the body.
Join them together with
a toothpick.

2. Secure the join.
Open the mouth with
a piece of cardboard.


3. Stick the eyes onto
the head and make
the nostril holes with
a toothpick.



A curious defense method

*If you try to catch a lizard,
it's quite likely that you will end
up with the tail moving in your
hand. It grows back over time.*

4. Make a sheet to cut out the animal's feet.
To make the back legs, join the foot to an
oval-shaped ball. For the front legs, join
a bent bottle-shaped sausage onto each
foot. Stick the four feet onto the body
securely with toothpicks.



5. Mark folds in the back legs.
Stick four pieces of scoubidou
into each foot to make the toes.

6. To finish, mark the skin texture
a little with some mesh.
