



# Bat






1. We need two large balls for the head and body. With two smaller balls, we will make the thighs. Model a cone for the tail.

2. Stick a little ball in the middle of the face. Mark the mouth with a toothpick and stick two white card triangles underneath. For the eyes, make two small holes with a sharp pencil.

3. Stick the head onto the body with a piece of toothpick. The ears are made from card (you will find the patterns on p. 35).

## Blind

*Bats sleep upside down during the day and fly at night. As they are very short sighted, they get their bearings thanks to sound waves. Most of them usually eat insects.*

4. For the feet, make a small cut in the middle of a piece of plastic tube and fold it. Stick it into the thighs up to the cut. Lastly, stick the legs onto the body.

5. Cut two wings out from thick card (model on p. 35). Spread modeling clay over both sides with your fingers. Stick pieces of plastic tube at the front to simulate the arms and fingers.

6. Stick the wings and the tail to the body. The tail will help the bat to stand upright.



# Ghost



1. Assemble the internal structure: A cylinder wider at the base, a ball for the head and two raised sausages for the arms. Join them all together with pieces of toothpick.

Prepare a white sheet 3-4 mm thick, large enough to cover the structure.



3. Give it the form of a sheet, with your fingers. Try to define the head and arms well. Mark some folds at the bottom. To finish, stick on three little black balls to simulate the eye and mouth holes.




# Spider

1. Model a ball for the head. First make the eyes from two yellow balls, then medium-sized ones and tiny ones at the end. Make some modeling clay eyebrows to give it an unfriendly expression... Mark the ball with a toothpick and stick some card fangs inside.

3. Join the two balls together with a piece of toothpick. Stick pieces of pipe cleaner into the body and fold them so that they support your spider well.

2. Cut some wool into very small pieces and cover the ball in it to give it a hairy body.

Many people are afraid of large hairy spiders. If you find a spider's web, there might be one nearby...




# Housekeeper



1


1. A rounded cylinder for the body, two sausages for the arms and an elongated ball for the head.

2. Make the hands (see p. 5). Join the arms to the body, raising one of them and smooth the joins. Flatten two balls to make the breasts, thinning them with your thumb.

3. Make the face (see p. 5). The eyes should have bags. Make two elongated balls and open a slot in the middle with a toothpick. Fill it with a small white sausage and a little black ball in the centre.



4. Place a strip of modeling clay around her head and spread it out. Stick a bun on and mark lines to make it look like hair. Stick a ball on the neck and stick the head on top.

5. With the help of a pencil, make a space under the dress to stick two triangles: The shoes. Stick a line of buttons onto the dress.

6. To finish, stick a cardboard key in her hand. Stick a cylinder onto a round base to make a candle and place it in the other hand. Don't forget the modeling clay flame.
