



PLATE paintings



What is your favorite means of transportation? Can you see it in any of these paintings?

1 Think about what subjects you want in your paintings and draw them on a piece of paper. We recommend that you use simple shapes where you can combine different colors.

2 Draw the pieces on construction paper and cut them out. When you draw bases, try to make them fit the round shape of the plate.

MATERIALS: colored disposable plates, colored construction paper, scissors, a glue stick, white glue, a paintbrush, two-sided tape, a sheet of paper, a pencil, a piece of string and masking tape.

3 Glue the pieces onto the plate using white glue or two-sided tape. You can use a glue stick for the very little pieces that go on top of the cardstock.

4 Are you ready to display your painting? All you have to do it stick a piece of string on the back using masking tape.


You can make paintings for your brothers, sisters and friends with your favorite subjects. They're a great gift!



Here is a way to make a beautiful painting on glass.


MATERIALS: colored and printed paper, washi tape, scissors, a glue stick, two-sided tape, markers, a pencil, a piece of paper, contact paper and a piece of glass or a window.

MY WINDOW garden



1 On a piece of paper, draw the composition that you want to make, with shapes that are easy to cut.

2 Draw each shape separately on colored paper and cut them out. You can also use the washi tape to make shapes or to decorate the shapes you have cut out.




3 Remove the protective back from the contact paper and stick on the shapes. Remember that they will be backwards. It is best if you first stick together the figures that are superimposed on each other with glue or two-sided tape.



4 When you're finished, you can stick it on a piece of glass to make a painting, or on a window in your house.

If you put it in your window you'll be able to see it every day, as if you were looking out at a garden.




SOFT animal mobiles



When you think about soft animals, which ones come to mind? Surely a little chick is one of the first!




MATERIALS: cotton, yarn, feathers, colored construction paper, scissors, two-sided tape, a glue stick, white glue, a dish, a paintbrush, markers, a pencil, masking tape and string.



1 Draw the parts of the animals you want to make on pieces of construction paper, then cut them out.

2 Glue the parts to each other. You can reinforce the parts where they come together by using masking tape on the back.



They look great, don't they? To make a mobile, just add a piece of string. They'll look fantastic anywhere!

3 Use white glue to stick on yarn or cotton balls (chick, sheep, etc.). Feathers can be attached using two-sided tape.

4 Color the details: the eyes, the mouth and whatever else you want to add. Stick on yarn legs for the chick and the sheep using masking tape on the back.
