



1. Paint a wooden crate your favorite color. You could use a fruit crate or any other one you have around the house. Remember that your dog must be able to fit inside comfortably.

2. Trace the pattern on page 34, cut around the outside and then use a pencil to trace the outline of the bone onto one side of the crate.

3. Paint the bone any color you like.

4. Put an old pillow into the crate so that your dog can lie down and be really comfortable in his new bed.



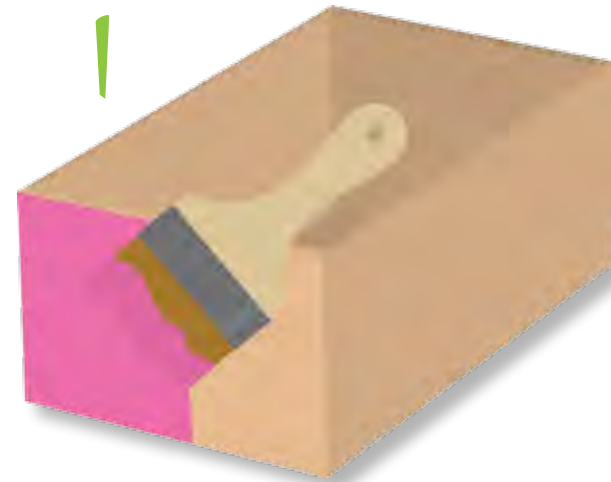
5. Write your dog's name inside the bone for a personal touch.

If you don't have a pillow, you can make it yourself: see page 24.





1. For this doggie version of hide-and-seek, you need a cardboard box tall enough so that empty toilet paper rolls will fit in. Paint the box any color you like.

2. When the paint is dry, decorate the box with trim, stickers or whatever you can think of.

3. Collect or find as many empty toilet paper rolls as will fit into the box, and then decorate them with colored markers, paint or stickers.

4. Place the decorated rolls into the box.

5. Put dry dog food inside the box. Now your dog will have to learn how to remove the rolls to find his treats.



This game is perfect for sharpening your furry friend's intelligence.



1. To make this chew toy for your dog, put two pieces of fabric together, one on top of the other. You could use an old t-shirt for example. Photocopy and cut out the pattern on page 35. Trace the outline onto the top piece of fabric.

2. Cut the two pieces out together, leaving a wide strip around the outline you made in step one.

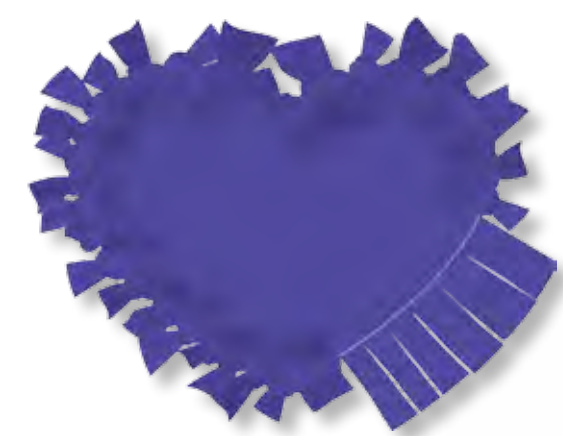

3. With the two pieces of cloth lined up, cut fringes into them, following the shape of your chew toy. Cut until you reach the line you made on the fabric. Don't make them too narrow, because then they may rip when you knot them.

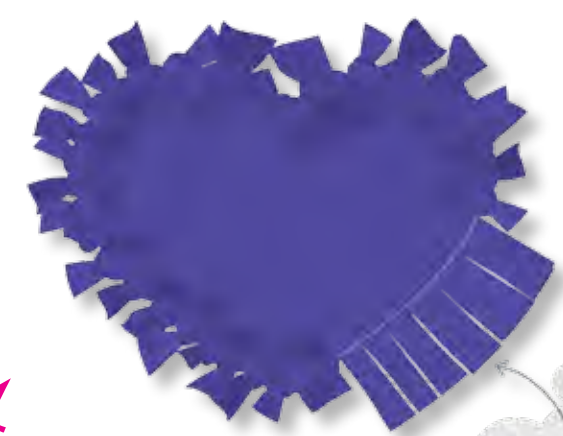

4. Take the two fringes that are on top and bottom and knot them. Keep on making knots, but leave several so that you have room to put the stuffing in.

5. Fill the chew toy so it is nice and soft, and then finishing knotting all the fringes so that no filling can come out. Your chew toy is ready!

You can make it any shape you like and, if you make it bigger, it can also be a cushion for your dog.
